M.Harrison: not playing merely because of a broken leg.

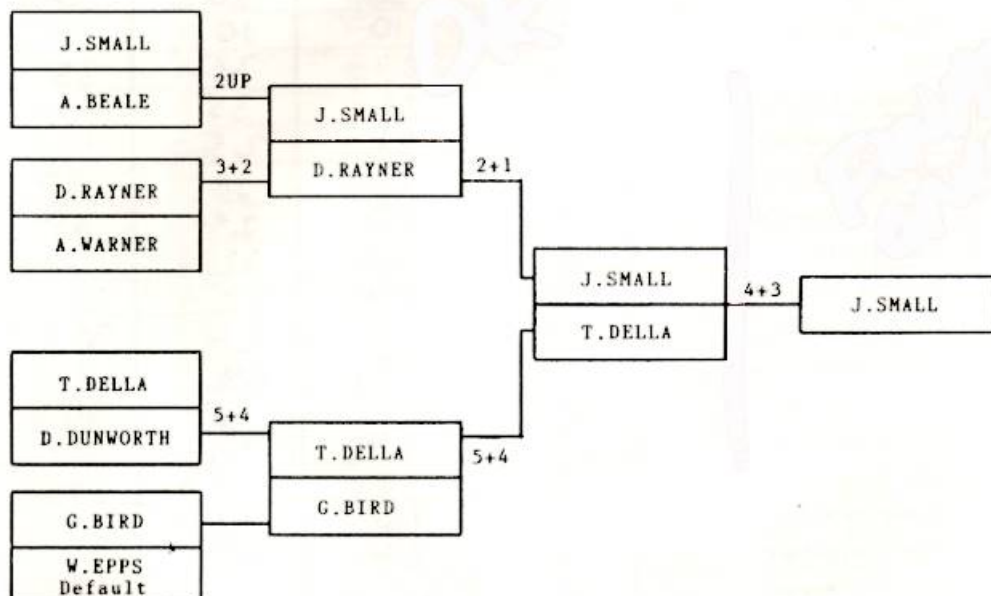
