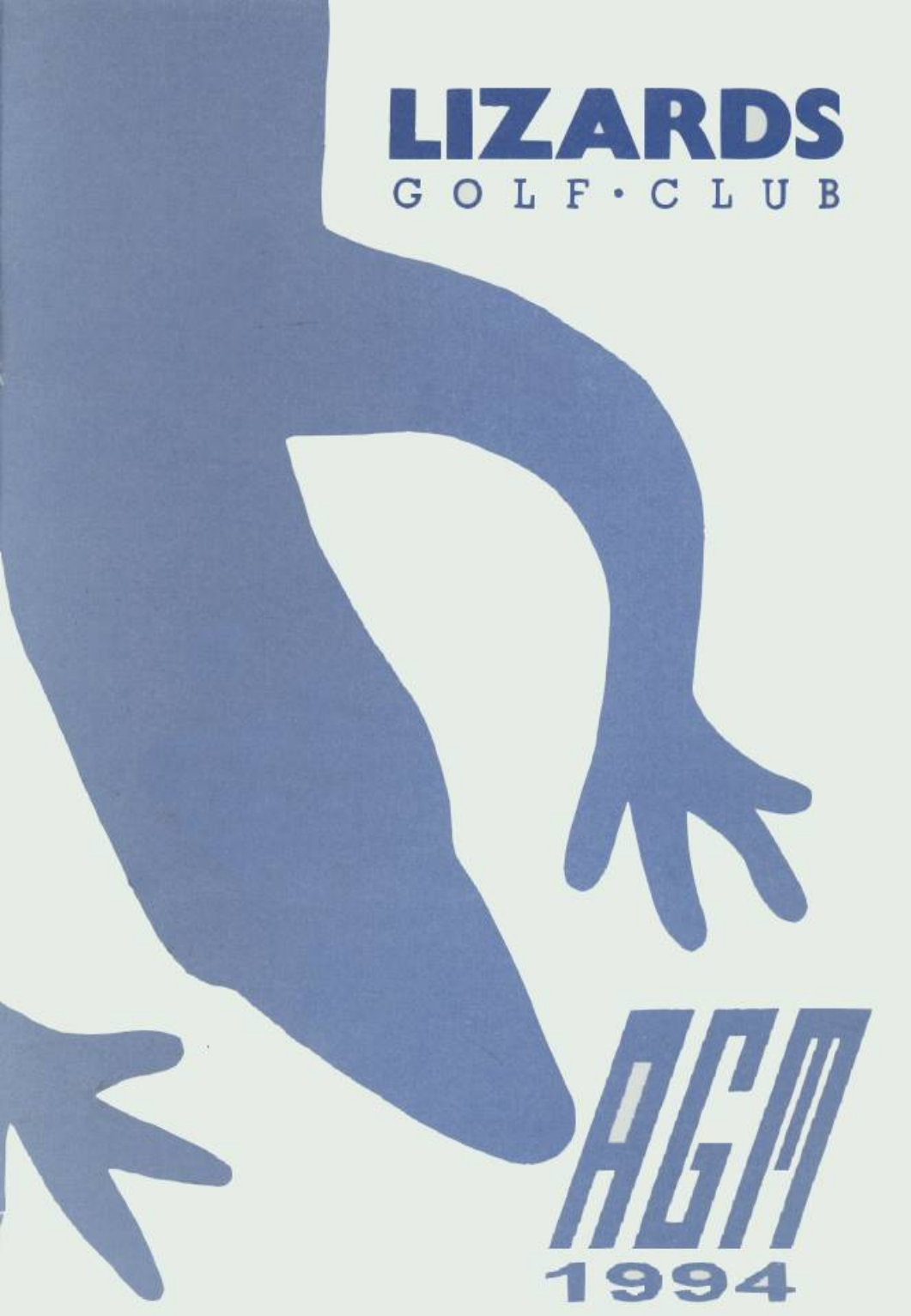

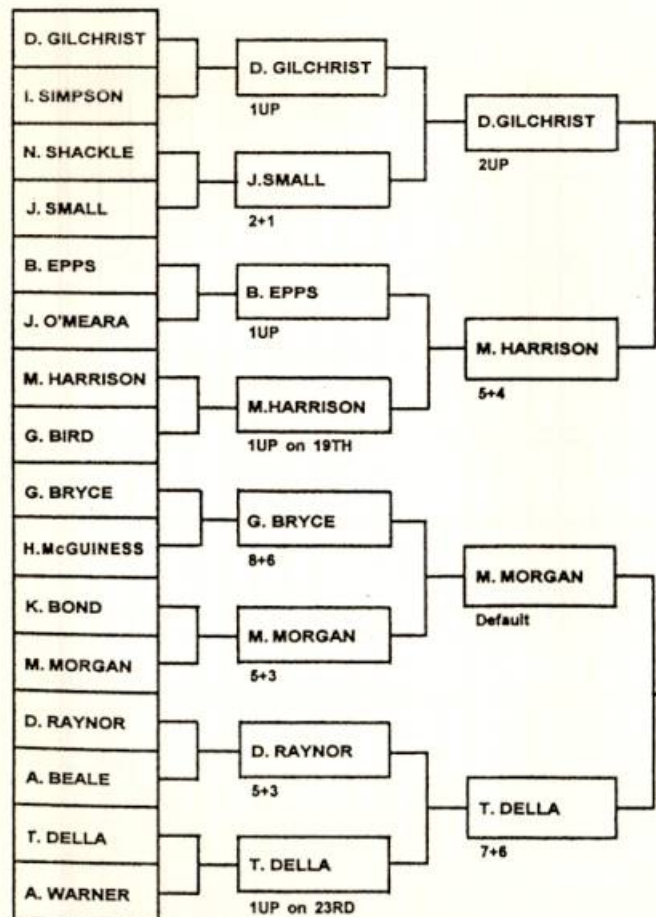

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From the Archives

The excerpts below are from a copy of the Flat Out Like published in February 1977 but also include quotes from an earlier version from 1966.

"Speaking of history, we know how the Lizard got his name- or do we? To add to the record I Quote from a statement of March 1966 (eleven years closer to the event).

A great habit among Manly men was to sunbake in the area above Manly Life Saving Club. A big bunch of fellows was doing just this on the particular Saturday that gave birth to the Lizards.

One of the Sun-Absorbers was Bill Howard, later to become President and Life Member of the Civic Club. Another regular sunbaker was the then Mine Host of the Hotel Steyne, Leon List.

Leon had a habit of spitting while taking in the sun and Bill Howard was aware of this. He was also aware that the beer, terribly scarce in those days, was about to come on at the Steyne. He was soon headed for the Saloon bar.(Yes Bill used to drink beer in those days. While partaking of his lation of the day, Greta, dispenser, asked Bill if he had seen the Boss at the Beach. "Yes" answered Bill. "He is down there spiting like a Lizard".

This remark was widely heard and by the time Leon List was back at work, it was all over the Steyne. Said one bloke to another: "Did you hear that Bill Howard called the Publican a Spitting Lizard?". This name was soon abbreviated to the Lizard and it stuck to him. Shortly afterwoods, a few drinkers from the Steyne had a social game of Golf, and they enjoyed it so much they decided to make the game a regular thing and to play every month.

A club was formed with Headquarters at the Steyne and the natural name to call such a organisation was The Lizard Golf Club. With a committee and proper organisation, Bill Howard was the first Patron.

But no one can tell me where the Great Lizard, our symbol of Presdential authority came from!

Other gleanings from our histerical past came from "Flat out Like No. 1" (August 1965) edited by Anon.- Lance Try produced two tattered pieces of paper which represented one of the two copies of the constitution known to exist thus exploding the myth of our unwritten Constitution. Those were the days of President Bill Sheehan, when Ken Foster was caterer, Eric MacMeechan was Baggage man, Lance Try assistant Baggage man and "virtually the Clubs Plant Engineer"!

So much for ancient history- much more with pictures- is provided today (courtesy of Pres. Roy Malm) in the short history provided today.

Modern history- January 1977- relates to Secretary/Treasurers Day which also saw the Annual Lizards V Manly Civic Club Cricket Club match. The cricketers showed they were better at golf than cricket by beating us Lizards by 406 points to 382. We may rest assured Captain/Handicapper will see to this in the future- they

had handicaps bigger than their cricket scores!

Sec/Treasurer trophies were awarded on secret hole system for the first and second nine [holes not kegs you Lizards] Fred Hanson won on the first nine and Harry Tipper the second.

Harry Tipper also took out first prize Lizards with 39 points off 10 [won't it be nice to be off single figures Harry]. Similarly Fred Hansen scored 39 off 28, coming second on a countback.

Peter Burgess [spelt burglar] won the visitors with 48 off 20. Andy Clues [a cricketer you note] scored 47 of 22 for visitors second prize.

Can't tell you about the nearest the pins etc. Uncle Dave keeps some secrets to himself. But we can report that Michael O'keefe on his first visit clearly won the Bradman even without the advantage of losing the head off his 5 iron on the 18th. tee. [In this instance both ball and clubhead were recovered].

Finally but certainly not the smallest item- let's give new Lizard Kevin Campbell a hearty welcome to prove that his initiation ceremony is not a permanent blot on his record- after all he has a big enough handicap sharing a surname with that bloke with the Scots accent..

And in fact next month Jock Ross and Alister Campbell present their own trophy on the same program as Father and Son Day. The Father and Son competition will as usual be a 4 BBB open to those playing under the Patrial system.- So go find yourself a playing son you Lizards.

The Year in Review

DECEMBER: Dawson finally gets to win his own trophy, pity it wasn't there. The new second tee is in full swing. The rash of bunkers continue to appear at Avalon. Ian Simpson wins a Nearest the Pin on the First before four-putting. Gordon Donald runs the raffle then wins it.

JANUARY: Grizz arrives minus his beard and comes last on the day. Ian Simpson joins the club. The club plays it's 570th tournament.

FEBRUARY: Michael Harrison hits a hole in one on the fourth. The Editor and the Printer win the raffles. A visitor named John West wipes seven holes to win the Bradman.

MARCH: Andy Warner & Tony Della take 23 Holes to complete their Lindenberg match. No visitors for the first time in eons. Chris Mooney has his first win since joining in 1992 with his Assistant Handicapper Michael Morgan taking second.

APRIL: Peter Grimes shoots one over, Michael Harrison four over and the Pres six over the card. Anthony & Debbie Beale's first son Joshua is born on the 20th of April at Mona Vale Hospital overlooking the golf course. Geoff Warren announces his move to N.Z. and thanks the members for their company over the years in a warm and well recieved speech.

MAY: Wal Hill holds centre stage as the sole airie. Two welcomed visitors battle it out for first and second in visitors. The President wins - again. An invitation is extended to play Avalon R.S.L. Social Golf Club later in the year.

JUNE: The Dobber shows his Cordon Bleu style still exists. A Mark Scott [who] imitator lobs at Lizards as do little seen AL Lewis and Mark MacMillan. The President winds up the playing year with a thank-you speech to members.
