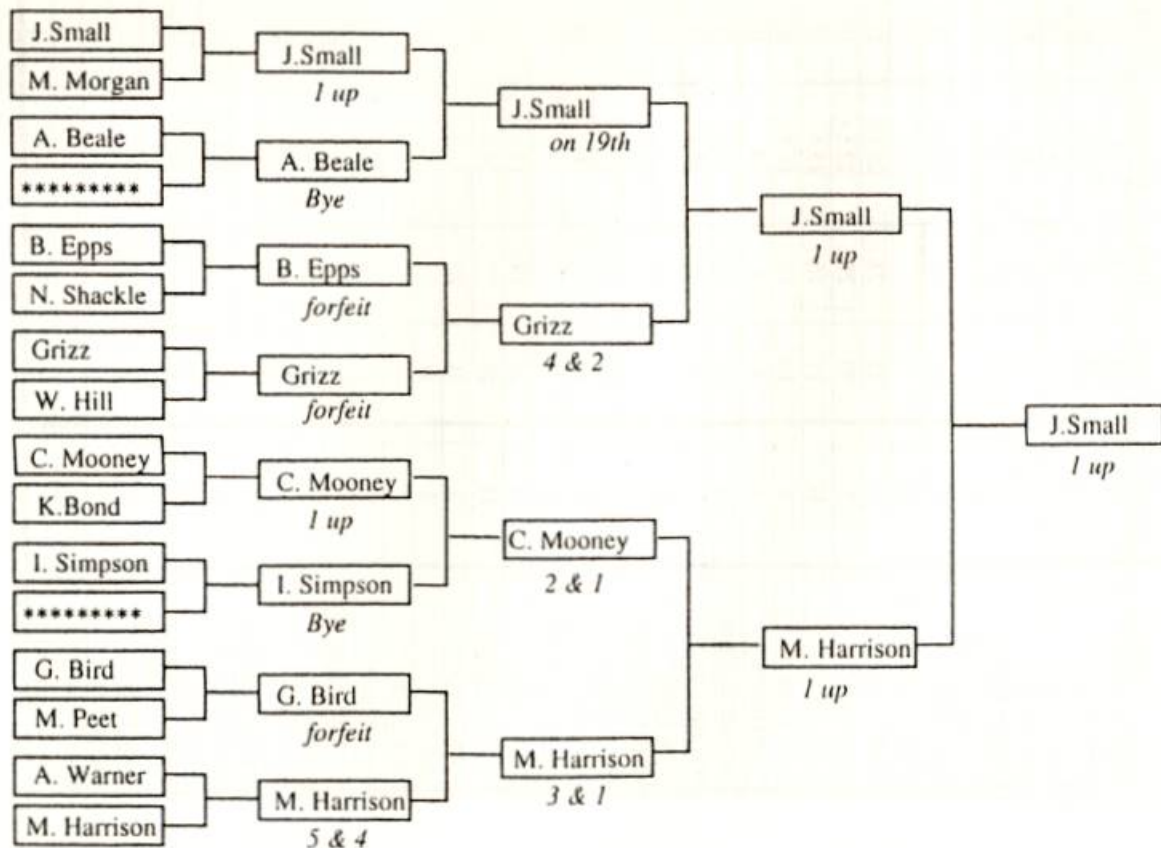

JULY
