RULES ON GOLF

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Tear off in case of emergency.

Rule 22. Lifting the ball. A ball lying on the putting green may be lifted for the purpose of cleaning without penalty, only before the player plays his first stroke and must be replaced on the spot from which it was lifted. Provided your ball does not lie on the putting green you "have" the balls on the green and there is no penalty if your ball strikes them.

Rule 24. (3) You never "have the pin" if your ball is lying on the putting green. It will cost you 2 strokes if you hit the flag stick whether or not it is attended, removed or unattended. Also wherever your ball is lying and however far from the hole you do NOT have the pin if it is attended or removed with your knowledge or authority.

Rule 35 (3e) Continuous putting. This applied only in individual or FOURSOMES stroke, par or Stableford competitions. (This obviously applies to our Lizards Individual Stableford monthly competitions). The player who is furthest from the hole putts first and continues to putt until he holes out and then the other player does likewise.
