STABLEFORD POINTS.

As promised in last month's sheet, an attempt will be made to hammer into your beer sodden skulls the method of working out Stableford points.

This is done at your President's request, to help our Capt. Handicapper. It's obvious that he needs more help than we can give him.

In passing, it should be mentioned that for the past four months, your Ed. has tried to din into a certain Lizard how to work them out. The clot's still none the wiser (I wouldn't dream of mentioning his name except that he comes from a long line).

Pay Attention ! Suppose your handicap is 26. This means that you get one stroke on all 18 holes plus another stroke for each hole with a par index of up to and including 8. i.e. $18 + 8 = 26$. The par index of a hole is shown on the card.

A par index of one indicates that it is the most difficult hole on the course to reach par figures and a par index of 18 is the easiest. So you can see that you get 2 strokes on holes up to par index 8 but only one stroke on holes over par index 8.

Suppose you take 6 strokes on Hole No.3 which has a par 4 and a par index of 1, then you get 2 strokes. So your nett score is $6 - 2 = 4$. Therefore, your amended score counts as follows.

For par (amended by your handicap) you get 2 pts.

For one over par (amended) you get 1 point.

For 2 or more over amended par you get 0.

If your amended score is one under par you get 3 pts. Two under you get 4 pts. and so on. So you see that if you get a hole in one on the 5th, you will earn 7 pts. Keep trying because there may be fairies at the bottom of your garden.
