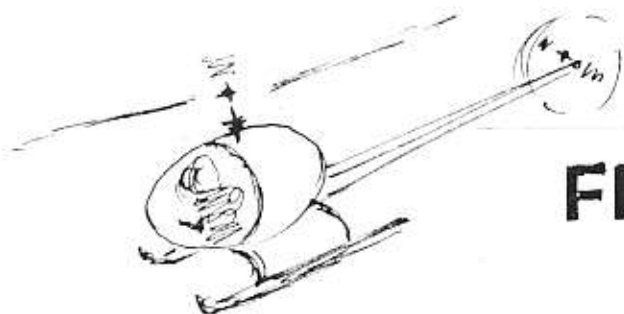




FLAT-OUT LIKE
