The longest drives are the 7th hole for players with handicaps of under 20 and the 15th hole for players with handicaps 20 and over.

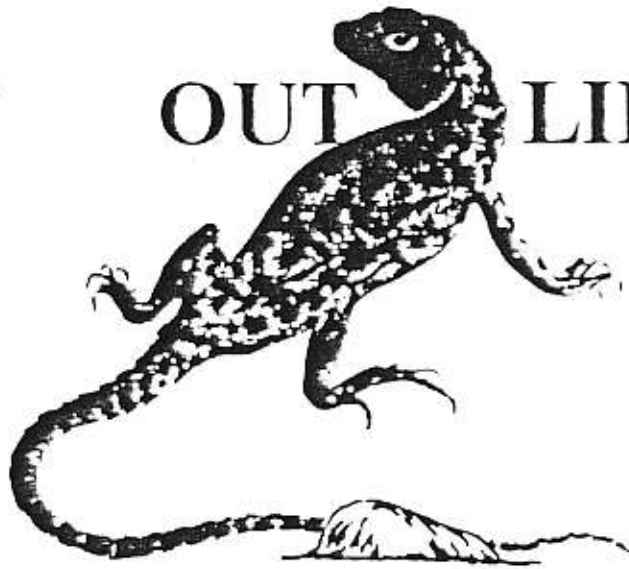
LOTTERY TICKETS will be available in the shed after the game from the CAPTAIN/HANDICAPPER.
