LOCAL RULES

(1) A 6" PREFERRED LIE MAY BE TAKEN ON THE MOUND PORTION OF ANY FAIRWAY; NO CLOSER TO THE HOLE. {PREFERRED LIES MAY NOT BE TAKEN IN THE ROUGH OR IN HAZARDS}

(2) A PLUGGED BALL:— A PLUGGED BALL MAY BE LIFTED AND DROPPED WITHOUT PENALTY, ANYWHERE ON THE COURSE EXCEPT IN A HAZARD.

(3) IF A BALL IS SEEN TO DISAPPEAR INTO "CRAUL WATER" AND IS LOST, A NEW BALL MAY BE DROPPED AT THE NEAREST POINT OF RELIEF {NO CLOSER THE HOLE} WITHOUT PENALTY.

(4) IF A BALL IS HIT "OUT OF BOUNDS" OR "INTO THE BUSH" THE PLAYER MAY DROP "SAND BALL", OR A NEW BALL ANYWHERE ALONG THE LINE FROM WHERE THE BALL WAS HIT, TO WHERE IT ENTERED THE AREA CONCERNED; AT A PENALTY OF ONE STROKE.

(5) RELIEF WITHOUT PENALTY IS ALLOWED FROM STAKED TREES AND "MANMADE" OBSTACLES {BINS, SEATS, PATHS, SHEDS} NO CLOSER THE HOLE.

(6) ALL MISKINGS COUNT.

(7) ALL ROLLINGS MUST BE MADE BY THE MARKER NOT THE PLAYER. P.D.
