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OBITUARY: DAVID TREHARNE, described by the press as one of the districts better known identities, died at the wheel of his workboat on 3rd. June, at the age of 75 fruitful years. Dave, proprietor of the Manly Boatshed had been a Manly Alderman, President of the Civic Club, Rotary Member, race starter and Life member of the Manly 16 Foot Skiff Club and President and longtime member of the Lizards Golf Club. Dave was known to have flashed his Lizard badge, to fellow members he happened to meet, in as far afield places as London and Paris. In 1965 he donated the pint Bradman pewter, which is still put to good use each month.
