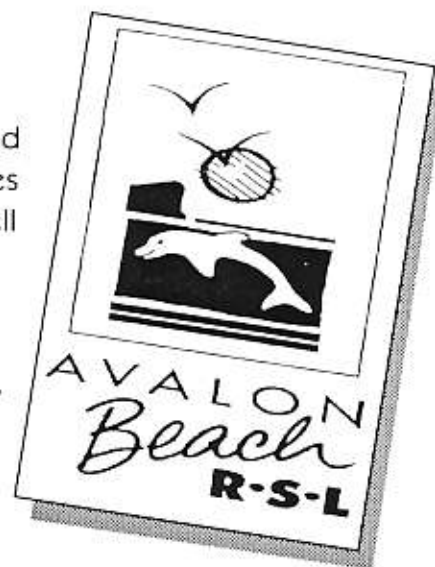
WELCOME to TONY DELLA DAY Mxxii and the 4th annual get together with the AVALON RSL GOLF CLUB.
