Prior to joining Lizards in 79, his right arm was shortened a couple of inches as a result of a motoring accident - but he still managed to play off single figures. He was the Lizards' first and only Croupier; President in 84 and found a home for the Lindenberg Trophy when he overheard Aub Lindenberg mention he was looking for a sporting body willing to play an annual match in memory of his athletic son, who died in his early 20's. Len and Tony have been increasing the prize list on their donors day - introducing Best Scratch, then Best Back and Front nines in 89 and nearest the Pins on all par 3's in 95. Today a "drive and pitch" on the downhill 7th has been included - this translates to a nearest the pin on the second shot for each of the two grades. TALKING ABOUT TROPHIES - and in answer to a recent enquiry - the sumptuous silver Championship Cup was originally presented as the Presidents Trophy at Woodland Golf Club, presumably in America, in 1926, then found its way to Australia and later hooked to Blaney Caines, a pawn broker, and member of Lizards. Blaney eventually passed the imposing piece of silversmithing to the Lizards "because no one could afford to buy it." A record of the 1926 win is buried under a shield, tastefully attached to the front of the cup.

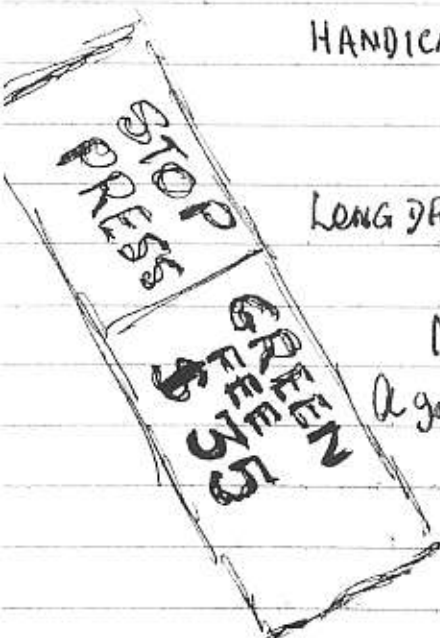
