LIZARDS RULES OF GOLF AND DEFINITIONS

September 2010

Preferred Lies

A ball may be lifted, without penalty, through the green, cleaned and placed on a spot within 30 centimetres of and not nearer the hole than where the ball originally lay, that is not in a hazard and not on the putting green.

Lost ball

If a ball is lost and not in a hazard, a ball may be dropped at the nearest point on the fairway (as agreed by the player's marker) where the ball was lost, under penalty of one stroke.

Out of Bounds

When a ball is hit beyond the boundaries of the course or into any part of the course marked as out of bounds, a ball may be dropped at the nearest point on the fairway (as agreed by the player's marker) to where the ball crossed the boundary, under penalty of one stroke.

Monthly Prizes

Anyone who wins a major prize (1st, 2nd or 3rd when applicable) will not be considered for the scratch or best front/back nines. Order of precedence should be 1st, 2nd, 3rd, scratch, best front, best back.

Scratch Winner

The scratch winner will be the person who did not come 1st, 2nd or 3rd (if applicable), and who had greater than 36 handicap Stableford points and scored the highest scratch Stableford points, provided that it is more than zero (calculated as the handicap Stableford score minus handicap).

Lapsed Members

A member will be regarded as a "Lapsed Member" if he has not presented a valid scorecard to the Handicapper within the previous 12 months; on return to play, the lapsed member shall play and be treated as a Visitor with respect to any prizes and/or results on the day. For subsequent matches, within the ensuing 12 months, provided he is financial, he will be regarded as a Lizard.
